From hands-on learning to educational tours to collaborative after-school programs, SHARP partners with educators to ensure that all students, no matter their circumstances, are provided opportunities to achieve academic success.

Fall and Spring In-School STEAM Workshops: SHARP's arts-integrated workshops utilize handson learning and STEAM concepts to enhance students' confidence in their ability to read and do math and science. Each workshop includes collaborative activities geared toward visual, kinesthetic and auditory learners.

Enrichment Opportunities

Reading With Programs

In our Reading with the Golden Eagles (Marquette University) and Reading with the Pios (Carroll University) programs, young learners bond with college athletes through mentorship and reading. Students discover that you have to be able to read, do math and pursue education to do well in sports. Our participating athletes learn how to give back to their community and inspire youth to pursue higher education.





Intergenerational Programs

Through a unique partnership with a school and a senior center, SHARP Literacy brings together elementary school children and older adults through reading and art. SHARP's Intergenerational program gets students out of the classroom and into their community. Through reading, writing, conversation and art, students and seniors build meaningful relationships with each other.





Johnson Controls Greenhouse and Garden

At Browning Elementary and Silver Spring Neighborhood Center, students learn sustainable gardening methods - aquaponics, composting, solar dehydration and rainwater harvesting. Students also dig deep into urban agriculture, food justice and nutrition.





At a Glance

- 8,500 students served in K3 5th grades
- 51 schools in Milwaukee, Racine, Waukesha (public, choice, charter)
- \$180 cost per student/year (free to schools)
- 85% of students come from homes classified as economically disadvantaged

SHARP Programs

• STEAM Core Program

K3-5th graders explore STEAM concepts through arts integration. Each class explores a topic ranging from living things, plants, seasons, and pollinators to financial literacy, culture and social studies.

Design Through Code

2nd through 5th grade students learn the basics of coding and essential skills that are valuable across a variety of disciplines from problem-solving and logic, to collaboration, critical thinking and creativity.

 After-School Learning Program provides a modified version of our school-year curriculum through learning opportunities at partner sites. Reading and academic content blend with hands-on art projects and experiential learning.



Summer Learning Program

reaches an average of 800 students in 26 schools/learning centers. This lessens the "summer slide" experienced by urban students in summer months

Educational Tours

provide K3-5th graders with the opportunity to visit museums, ecology centers and experiential education sites. All programs above feature an educational tour, increasing students' knowledge retention and awareness of their community.

In our Reading with the Golden Eagles and Reading with the Pios programs, young learners bond with student athletes through mentorship and reading.




History
